## How to get an Ohio driver's license

**Step 1:** Take driver education with All Star

**Step 2:** Get TIPIC (permit) from the BMV

**Step 3:** Finish behind-the-wheel training

**Step 4:** Practice driving for at least 50 hours

**Step 5:** Take the driving and skills test

**Step 6:** Get probationary license

When the student turns 18, they will qualify for their full, unrestricted driver's license!

# The Road to Freedom

## STEP 1: TAKE DRIVER EDUCATION

When the student turns 15 years and 5 months old, they can start driver education. The class consists of 24 hours of classroom or online instruction and at least eight hours of behind-the-wheel with one of our state certified instructors. Please note that the student must complete the 24 hours of driver education and have their TIPIC before beginning the required eight hours of behind-the-wheel training.

## STEP 3: BEHIND-THE-WHEEL TRAINING

The student has 180 days to complete the course with us, which includes the classroom or online course, the state minimum of eight behind-the-wheel lessons and passing a knowledge test and vision exam. The state requires at least eight hours of driving with an instructor, however, we offer packages with more than eight hours of behind-the-wheel driving in case the student needs more practice. Once these requirements are fulfilled, a certificate of completion will be sent by mail.

## STEP 5: TAKE THE DRIVING AND SKILLS TEST

When the student turns 16 years old, has had their certificate of completion for at least six months and has completed the 50 Hour Affidavit, they are ready to schedule their road test! The road test is split into a driving portion and a maneuverability (skills) portion. Make sure to bring the following to the BMV:

- Certificate of completion of driver education
- TIPIC
- 50 Hour Affidavit (however, this can be obtained at the BMV)
- A parent or guardian to sign for the license
- Payment for the license fee (\$25.75 for age 16; \$24.50 for age 17)

## STEP 2: GET TIPIC (PERMIT) FROM THE BMV

When the student turns 15 years and 6 months old, they are eligible for their Temporary Instruction Permit Identification Card (TIPIC). This card is needed to complete the behind-the-wheel training required by the state. The following is required to obtain a TIPIC:

- Proof of identity, date of birth, Social Security Number, Ohio residency and U.S. citizenship/legal presence
- Payment for the \$23.50 permit fee
- Parent or guardian signature
- A passed knowledge test and vision screening

## STEP 4: PRACTICE DRIVING

Once the student receives this certificate, they will need to practice behind the wheel for an additional 50 hours with a parent or guardian, with 10 of those hours being at night. The student will need to get a 50 Hour Affidavit signed and notarized by their parent or guardian in order to get their license. This can be done at the BMV when the student takes their road test or the form can be found at [www.PublicSafety.Ohio.Gov/Static/BMV5791.PDF](http://www.PublicSafety.Ohio.Gov/Static/BMV5791.PDF). Unfortunately, behind-the-wheel drives with All Star don't count as part of the 50 hours of supervised driving.

## STEP 6: GET PROBATIONARY LICENSE

Once the student passes the driving test, they will receive their probationary license.
